  - 7. note that professional drag artists are not limited by gender and that Kings are equally welcome.

  - 2. conduct this election by the method of open voting (show of hands); and
  - 3. conduct this election of the Deputy Mayor in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government (General) Regulation 2021.

For the Motion were Councillors Southwood, Bennison, Bryla, Flood, Greenwell, Kennedy, Little, Roenfeldt and Taylor (Total 9).

Against the Motion was Nil (Total 0).

## **Election of Deputy Mayor**

Council received three valid nominations for the position of Deputy Mayor for the term ending September 2026 from Councillor Katie Little, Councillor Rochelle Flood and Councillor Caleb Taylor.

The Local Government Regulation requires that there be a final vote between two candidates, thus the first round of voting was to determine these two candidates.

The results for the first round of voting were:

- votes for Councillor Little Councillor Roenfeldt and Councillor Little (2)
- votes for Councillor Taylor Councillor Bennison and Councillor Taylor (2)
- votes for Councillor Flood Councillor Southwood, Councillor Kennedy, Councillor Bryla, Councillor Greenwell and Councillor Flood (5).

As two Councillors tied, both their names were returned to the ballot box, with the first one to be drawn to be excluded from the election. Councillor Taylor's name was drawn first.

The results for the second round of voting were:

- votes for Councillor Flood Councillor Southwood, Councillor Kennedy, Councillor Bryla, Councillor Greenwell and Councillor Flood (5)
- votes for Councillor Little Councillor Roenfeldt and Councillor Little (2)
- Councillor Taylor and Councillor Bennison abstained from this vote.

Councillor Flood was elected as Deputy Mayor.

Councillor Flood thanked her fellow Councillors for their support in electing her to the role of Deputy Mayor and expressed that this was a great opportunity for her as a second term Councillor. Councillor Flood also congratulated the outgoing Deputy Mayor, Councillor Kennedy.

The Mayor, Councillor Southwood, congratulated Councillor Flood on becoming Deputy Mayor and expressed that she was looking forward to them working together.

The Mayor also thanked Councillor Kennedy for her support during the Mayor's first term, particularly noting Councillor Kennedy's strategic thinking skills and her valued counsel on different approaches and views.
