1 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Councillor Flood declared that she has a non-significant, non-pecuniary interest in item 11.5 – Notice of Motion – Improving Walking and Cycling Infrastructure in Lane Cove. Councillor Flood works for Greens MP Kobi Shetty who is the party spokesperson for sustainable cities/active transport. REMOVAL OF LANE COVE BUS STOPS

42 **RESOLVED** on the motion moved by Councillor Flood and seconded by Councillor Greenwell that Council:

1. write to Transport for NSW, the Minister for Transport and the State MP for Lane Cove:
 - a) expressing concern about the permanent removal of the bus stop on Epping Road after Fraser Street (TSN 2066247) and the removal of the bus stop on Burns Bay Road at Garthowen Ave (TSN 206650),
 - b) explaining the disproportionate impact the removal of these bus stops will have on elderly residents, people with prams, and those with health and/or mobility concerns,
 - c) requesting these bus stops be reinstated as a matter of urgency to ensure all Lane Cove residents can continue accessing the bus service.
2. note Council's disappointment that the opening of the Metro, and the earlier privatisation of the Region 7 bus network has consistently led to poorer bus services for Lane Cove and urges Transport for NSW and the Government to invest in improvements to Lane Cove's bus services, including bringing the Region 7 bus network back into public hands when the lease expires in 2030 or earlier if feasible.
3. delegate to the General Manager the preparation of a media release on this issue and its circulation to relevant media outlets.

 - c) the contractual or formal governance framework supporting each arrangement,
 - d) the oversight, reconciliation and auditing mechanisms currently applied,
 - e) any identified inconsistencies, gaps or risks and measures to address any identified risks, including whether existing third-party arrangements are still warranted.
2. note that this review is not to include existing contractual arrangements related to advertising on Council bus shelters, management of council recreation facilities such as Galuwa or the Lane Cove Aquatic Centre and parking operations.
3. request that the report in Item 1 also includes a review of the arrangements relating to the management of advertising panels in Market Square, including:
 - a) the current agreement with the Lane Cove Business Chamber,
 - b) revenue reconciliation processes,
 - c) payment consistency and timeliness,
 - d) conflict of interest and probity safeguards,
 - e) advice on whether the existing third-party arrangement is still warranted.

Item 11.3 NOTICE OF MOTION - URGENT CHANGE OF BUILDING MANAGER - LANE COVE MARKET SQUARE

1. note the ongoing failures of lifts, escalators and travelators at Lane Cove Market Square, and the continued negative impact on accessibility, safety and community confidence.
2. note that no measurable or sustained improvement has occurred since Council's October 2025 resolution addressing vertical transport failures.
3. acknowledge that the governance and ownership arrangements at Market Square are complex, involving multiple lot owners, leasehold interests, and contractual arrangements.
4. express its lack of confidence in the current building and facilities management arrangements overseen by Knight Frank on behalf of the Stratum Lot Owners, given the continued and repeated failures of essential infrastructure.
5. further request that the General Manager concurrently obtain advice (including legal where necessary) to:
 - a) clarify lot ownership within the strata plan for Lane Cove Market Square,
 - b) outline the leasehold structure within Market Square,
 - c) detail the contractual arrangements with Knight Frank as Facilities Manager,
 - d) determine Council's responsibility for lifts, travelators and escalators, including proportional responsibility across the strata scheme,
 - e) identify Council's ability to divest or restructure its interests within the strata plan.
6. request a report to the May or June Council meeting that:
 - b) outlines actions that could be taken to appoint a new building and facilities management provider,
 - c) provides the advice outlined in point 6,
 - d) identifies available legal, contractual and advocacy options should satisfactory action not be taken,
 - e) outlines options and costs associated with the repair or replacement of vertical transport infrastructure, noting the 2025 independent report identifying these assets are approaching end of life.

Item 11.5 NOTICE OF MOTION - IMPROVING WALKING AND CYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE IN LANE COVE

1. commit to clear strategic priorities to support the delivery of more active transport infrastructure to encourage walking and cycling in Lane Cove including:
 - a) supporting an urban design led approach to improve walking and cycling amenity in the Lane Cove village and across the Local Government Area with a goal to create streets that are shared spaces for people not just cars,
 - b) confirming that our Community Strategic Plan aims to 'Prioritise walking, cycling, and public transport as alternatives to driving' and affirms that these are preferred transport options,
 - c) recognising that separated cycleways align with best practice and would provide the safest options for both pedestrians and cyclists,
 - d) reconfirming Council's commitment to ensure bike paths are not built in bushland.
2. seek to identify opportunities to reallocate road space to support the construction of safe separated cycleways to improve cycling connectivity and keep pedestrians safe.
3. note that the General Manager has confirmed that consideration of the revised Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan (PAMP) and Bike Plan will be presented to Council for adoption at the same time at a meeting to be held later in 2026.
4. request staff to investigate options to better align the PAMP and the Bike Plan in the future via the development of an Integrated Transport Strategy.
5. request consideration be given to setting measurable performance goals for the delivery of new active transport infrastructure for inclusion in relevant strategic documents including the new draft bike plan.
6. write to the Federal Member for Bennelong, the Honourable Jerome Laxale MP, and the State Member for Lane Cove, the Honourable Anthony Roberts, to:
 - a) seek state and federal funding contributions in support of the active transport goals Lane Cove; and local government more broadly,
 - b) advocate for increased state and federal budget allocations for active transport infrastructure all levels of government.

1. acknowledge its commitment to the cultural sector and recognises that there is currently no alternative operational funding available from State or Federal Government sources to sustain this program.
2. provide a financial assistance package of \$100,000 to Gallery Lane Cove + Creative Studios, commencing in the current financial year and to be determined by the General Manager to stabilise operations and support a structured turnaround plan.
3. work collaboratively with the Gallery Lane Cove + Creative Studios Board over the next six months to determine the sustainable operational funding model for both the Creative Studios Agreement (expires June 2027) and the Gallery Management Agreement (due for renewal December 2026) to ensure the new funding arrangement tied to these agreements reflects the true cost of maintaining and sustaining this valuable community asset.
4. require the Gallery to use this financial assistance package to:
 - implement improved financial management and cost-control measures.
 - invest in technology and systems to reduce administrative workload and staffing pressure.
 - strengthen targeted marketing to grow earned revenue and participation.
 - align a minimum of three key exhibitions with Council's Community Strategic Plan priorities (e.g. Chinese New Year, NAIDOC Week, curated cultural programs, Children's Art Award).
 - deliver measurable outcomes in arts education, social inclusion, community connection, and career pathways for artists.
5. intend this one-year investment would act as a stabilisation and reset measure, enabling the gallery and studios to restructure, improve efficiency, and position itself for longer-term financial sustainability.
6. delegate to the General Manager to:
 - a) write to the Federal Member for Bennelong seeking support for the organisation (Gallery Lane Cove + Creative Studios), including advocacy, opportunities for additional arts and cultural funding streams, and partnership or community-engagement opportunities;
 - b) write to the Commonwealth Special Envoy for the Arts and the New South Wales Minister for the Arts seeking support and opportunities for additional arts and cultural funding streams relevant to the organisation; and
 - c) report back to Council on outcomes of this correspondence and any identified opportunities for collaboration or support.

Item 16.2 REVISED SCOPE FOR LANE COVE NORTH SPEED REDUCTION PROPOSAL - LOCAL TRANSPORT FORUM - OUT OF CYCLE REPORT

53 **RESOLVED** on the motion moved by Councillor Flood and seconded by Councillor Southwood that Council adopt the recommendations of the Lane Cove Local Transport Forum Out of Cycle Report with the following additions regarding Karilla Avenue line markings,

That Council:

1. note resident concerns about proposed line markings along Karilla Avenue, with concerns raised about the painted lines at both ends of the street including the cul-de-sac.
2. note the concerns of residents in the top half of Karilla between Centennial Avenue and Kurri about rat-running and the speed of vehicles causing safety concerns.
3. note that Council has sought a time extension for the use of the State Government grant to permit an additional round of consultation on traffic calming for the Karilla cul-de-sac, including the potential for a single speed cushion instead of line markings, which was refused.
4. note that the line markings on the Karilla Avenue cul-de-sac are a requirement set by Transport for NSW in order to implement the 40km/h plan for Lane Cove North.
5. note that the failure to implement traffic calming in the cul-de-sac could undermine the broader plan for safer streets with 40km/h speeds in the wider Lane Cove North precinct, not just on Karilla Avenue.
6. confirm that consultation in 2022-2023 revealed that Lane Cove residents were broadly supportive of the plans for 40km/h in Lane Cove North to help improve road safety.
7. undertake the line markings on Karilla Avenue, as required by Transport for NSW.
8. confirm Council's commitment to undertake a review of the traffic calming measures on Karilla Avenue, including undertaking an origin-destination study within 12 months of the traffic calming measures being installed on Karilla (in accordance with item 2.7 in the December 2024 Council meeting) and
 - a) include a review of the effectiveness and any unintended consequences of the additional traffic calming measures implemented in accordance with Transport for NSW requirements.

1. endorse the Lane Cove submission to the NSW Parliamentary Inquiry into Data Centres in NSW, with the following additions:
 - a. note concern about brownouts and blackouts increasing in Lane Cove West since the expansion of data centres,
 - b. advocate for a user pays model where the proponent be required to fund the water and electrical infrastructure to support the demand expected to be generated from their data centre (noting that this has been adopted overseas including in the United States where major technology companies signed a "Ratepayer Protection Pledge" to ensure these services are delivered and funded by the companies),
 - c. express concern about the health impacts from the use of back-up diesel generators - particularly when located near homes and schools. Advocate for stricter monitoring and reporting requirements for data centres, with clear restrictions on how often back-up diesel generators can be used. This should be accompanied by appropriate penalties to ensure compliance,
 - d. express concern about the noise impact on residents from large data centres being located close to homes and key social infrastructure like schools. The noise generated by data centres can be offensive and disruptive and should be a key factor considered prior to approval,
 - e. expand on concerns regarding data centres adjacent to bushland, with particular reference to: light spill, noise concerns impacting wildlife, diesel fumes impacting the health of wildlife, construction impacts including sediment run-off from excavation and overshadowing concerns,
 - f. note that the expanding number of data centres could negatively impact Australia's emissions targets and could undermine efforts to better conserve water given the current reliance on drinkable water for data centre cooling. Recommend stricter regulations requiring recycled water use for data centres, and renewable energy use to minimise these concerns,
 - g. support the recommendations in the Draft Reforms from the Australian Energy Market Commission,
2. authorise the General Manager to finalise Council's submission and to submit to the NSW Parliamentary Inquiry.
